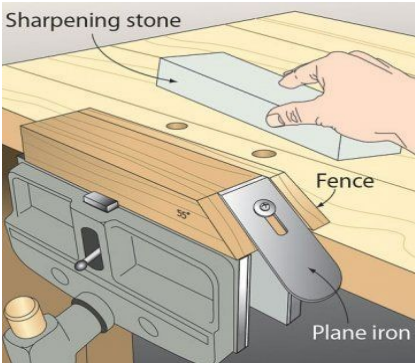
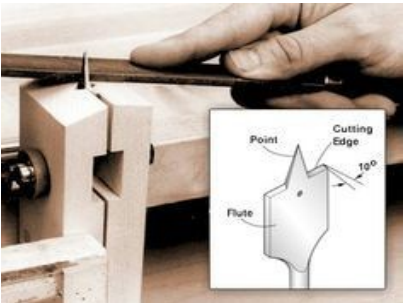

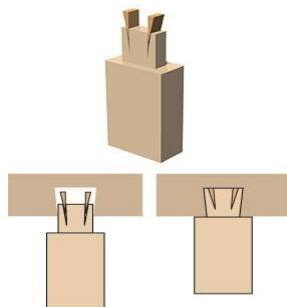

## **MEMBER BEHIND THE BADGE:**

**Perrie Bullock** – Born in Johannesburg in 1939. Remembers some of the war rationing. Move to Vereeniging late in the war. Went to boarding school at the age of 10, in the Eastern Cape Province, about 850kms from Home. He is descended from the settlers in Grahamstown on his mother side.

The Eastern Cape is very similar in circumstances to Victoria. On a recent visit, he noted how many of the farms have been consolidated, and employ minimum of people game farming. Previously it was Sheep, Cattle, Pineapple and Chicory. His grand-parent grew pineapples in Bathurst (South Africa), 65km from his boarding school. It took a 2 day train trip to get back home, and much fun was had on the trains with no teachers and parents. When his father retired, he took up the editor's position of the local Newspaper, which was over 100 years old.

Finished School in 1957 (Year 10). Went to agricultural College and got a diploma. Was going to join his grandfather on the farm, but times were tough and no work was available. Found a Job in Swaziland on a sugar estate. Met his Wife Peggie at College, now has 2 daughters and a son, 3 grand-children. Eldest Grandson has finished Uni, and is going to get married next year.

<sup>2nd</sup> Daughter lives just out of Shepparton and is a Lawyer for Dawes & Vary Riordan. His son is in IT and sells SAP software to the corporate's, has 3 kids, 2 sons and a daughter. Worked in Swaziland on the sugar estate for 14 years, ran cattle, grew rice, swapped over to sugar. Grew 240 tonnes of sugar. Moved south to Natal, where he operated a smaller sugar mill, which has a distillery on it that continues to operate today. It produces about 20 million litres of alcohol a year.

Member of Round Table from 73-79 and was the Treasurer, Secretary and Chairman. Started wood turning in the 80's with a Black and Decker (a 2 speed trigger drill mounted with a tail stock). Bought a <sup>2nd</sup> hand lather and started from there. He joined the Woodworkers Association of Durban. He had to travel 110kms for meetings. Retired to Durban, in 2003 he became Chairman of the club, and was awarded life membership. While there he went to the UK and joined the British Association of Wood turners, and toured through Wales and Anglesea and met many turners. Also Joined the Baynesfield Antique Woodworkers Guild where he built Wagon Wheel's from scratch and

Attended the association of woodworkers of South Africa symposium, where international wood turners were invited. Turners such as Phil Innes, Nick Arnold, Nick Agree, Trent Bosch, Stuart King.

Has also organised and lead Safari trips for his friend and family. Trips to Botswana, Zambia, Namibia and Mozambique.
